WSU 2012 LID Technical Workshop Series

The Washington State University (WSU) 2012 Low Impact Development Workshop Series will provide you with the technical details necessary to properly design, build and maintain LID projects. The four, two-day workshops, with instruction by regional and national experts, includes the current state of knowledge on these topics and more:

- * Bioretention siting, sizing and modeling techniques, designing surface and subsurface drainage components, and soil mixes.
- * Permeable paving specifications for permeable asphalt, concrete, interlocking concrete pavers, and other paving systems, as well as subgrade preparation, base material specifications, modeling, and maintenance.
- * Vegetated roof design, construction and modeling, rain water harvesting design and construction, and low impact PIN foundations design.
- * Site planning and preparation, temporary erosion and sediment control (TESC), LID construction sequencing, and inspection.

All workshops will be held at the new WSU LID research facility (2606 W Pioneer Puyallup, WA 98371).


