This group will collaboratively design an outreach campaign to reduce illicit discharges and stormwater pollution associated with small concrete projects. Ecology withdrew the Rule Making announcement notices for chapters 173-503A, 173-525, and 173-526 WAC.

Every 2 years, the Water Environment Federation (WEF; Alexandria, Virginia) coordinates the most robust stormwater data-gathering effort in the U.S., polling a diverse array of MS4 permittees on the state of their programs as well as their most significant challenges. The 2024 U.S. MS4 Needs Assessment Survey now is underway, accepting responses through January 31, 2025. This survey informs many legislative proposals and so is worth the time to complete.
