News State, National & Legislative Update

Ecology proposes to reissue the Winery State Waste Discharge General Permit. The current permit was issued in July 2019 and will expire on July 1, 2024. The draft permit is available for review and public comment from Jan.18, 2024, through March 1, 2024, at 11:59 pm. We will host informational workshops and public hearings on the draft permit. The draft permit, fact sheet (which explains the legal and technical basis for the permit), and associated documents are available on our <u>Winery General Permit webpage</u>. Does anyone have examples of Adjustments or Exceptions to the Stormwater Management Manual for Western Washington? We have to make that decision for a development proposed in the city. The developer is unable to comply with Wetland Hydroperiod Protection for the daily discharge volumes from the site and is seeking an Adjustment from Minimum Requirement #8 Wetlands Protection. If you have any examples or can point me to someone who may have already had to do something like this, that would be great.
