#### Update: Statewide MS4 Permittee Mentorship Program

Thanks to all who responded to the survey solicitation! We received 119 responses. As promised, attached are the survey results. Spoiler Alert – There seems to be enthusiastic support to develop a statewide MS4 Permittee mentorship program.

Informed by the responses gathered from the survey and regional Permittee meeting discussions, we're taking the next step of scheduling a mid-April kickoff meeting to bring together the folks willing to invest their time to assist with the program's development. This kickoff meeting aims to: 1) identify program development tasks, 2) form workgroups to carry out those task assignments, and3) identify leads for each workgroup. The Stormwater Strategic Initiative Lead (SIL), led by the Washington Departments of Ecology and Commerce and the Washington State University Stormwater Center, is proud to announce a new competitive funding opportunity coming March 15, 2024. Selection criteria will align with the 2023 Investment Plan priorities and the Implementation Strategy, and this opportunity will be targeting projects that innovate or test best management practices (BMPs) in toxic hotspots and transportation areas for the removal of 6PPD, 6PPDQ, or PCBs, and potentially other contaminants, from Puget Sound watersheds.

The funding opportunity will award up to \$1.5 million in total and will fund up to\$500,000 per proposal through the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Puget Sound Geographic Program Funds.
